RamG was increasingly experiencing physical irregularities that eventually made life impossible. After visiting countless doctors, RamG was eventually diagnosed with Chronic Inflammatory Demyelinating Polyneuropathy or CIDP. The disease is caused by the body's own immune cells, which normally protect the body from foreign infection, attacking the body's nerves. Initially, RamG experienced a constant, slight trembling of his hands, but as time progressed, he physically deteriorated further. He lost his sense of balance, particularly when climbing up and down stairs, and increasingly found it difficult to complete any task requiring the use of fine-motor skills.

‘I first noticed that my hands were constantly shaking when using cutlery, but I thought nothing of it and put it down to stress. However, over time the hand shaking grew steadily worse and other physical issues started to appear. Climbing stairs became an ordeal as I was losing my sense of balance, and the strength in my fingers and legs was deteriorating. I could no longer do up the buttons on my shirts or lift a simple plate without difficulty. My muscles were waning and eventually I had to give up driving, something which I love. My entire world was falling apart,’ explained RamG.

No longer able to effectively deliver in his new position, RamG was forced to switch roles while he pursued a

diagnosis of his illness. Seven years lapsed before it was correctly identified as CIDP. A nerve biopsy confirmed the diagnosis and RamG immediately sought treatment options.

‘At the time, the standard medication for my condition was an intravenous drug called IVIG. This had a very positive effect on me initially, but after 45 days my body began to weaken. My doctor suggested a course of steroids followed by another round of IVIG. Over the next three years I took IVIG every two months, but the positive effects were waning quicker and quicker, while the dosage of steroids was increasing. I bloated up like a balloon, adding 14 kilograms to my weight. My eyesight was fading thanks to the steroids and my condition was steadily deteriorating,’ said RamG.

In spite of his worsening state, RamG remained positive and pursued a rigorous exercise program. He also kept searching the web for alternative solutions. It was while scanning the internet that RamG stumbled across a clinical trial taking place at Northwestern Memorial Hospital in Chicago. As fate would have it, the doctor running the trial was scheduled to speak in India and

RamG attended the talk with his wife. After meeting and speaking with Dr Richard Burt, RamG decided to try the new treatment.

'The treatment, which is called Autologous Nonmyelobative Hematopoietic Stem Cell Transplant, involves harvesting your own stem cells, knocking out your existing immune system and then injecting the stem cells back into your body. The entire evaluation and treatment process took 10 weeks,' explained RamG.

While in hospital RamG decided to write a book that had been festering in his head for some time. 'The treatment gave me renewed hope and I also had ample free time, so while we awaited the results of the treatment, I was motivated to write. This was something I had always wanted to do, a dream really, but for one reason or another it had never materialised. The only problem now was that my fingers were completely useless. I could only type with my thumbs and I could not lift a pen to write,' said RamG.

A friend suggested that RamG try Dragon NaturallySpeaking. Dragon NaturallySpeaking or Dragon as it is more commonly known, brings voice recognition to the PC and allows individuals to simply talk to create content and command a computer. It eliminates the need for typing and delivers up to 99 percent recognition accuracy. By using Dragon's powerful voice recognition software people can interact with and command their PC as well as cruise through email, surf the Web and create reports and notes just by speaking.

RamG downloaded Dragon and after only a couple of hours training he was up and running. As he explained, 'Dragon comes with a very easy to use tutorial which is simple to understand. He recently launched his second book, *From Ouch to Oops*, a light-hearted and humorous narrative about his courageous struggle.
