To find the perfect OCR partner for your business and avoid potential pitfalls, follow these six guidelines:

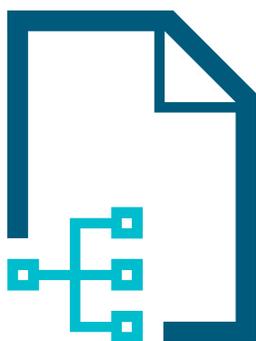
1. Brand history and reputation



Finding a partner with a proven track record and history of success is the best way to avoid potential behind-the-scenes issues or shortcomings. To narrow down your search, take a close look at a vendor's history, how long they've been in business, their customer base, the breadth and depth of solutions they provide and whether they offer support and warranties for their products.

Also look to see if a vendor is merely repackaging and reselling OCR technology, or if they're designing proprietary technology in-house. You want to ensure they can provide the right technology and be the right partner for your business.

2. Robustness of solution



Organizations use a variety of different document programs and create and share an even wider selection of formats. The OCR solution you choose should support a wide range of these image and application formats, including JPG, TIF, PNG and PDF. Document conversion capabilities should be available for Microsoft Office's entire suite of applications, including Word®, Excel®, PowerPoint® and Corel® WordPerfect®, as they are arguably the most widely used among businesses today.

Having access to these capabilities, as well as the ability to integrate template-based forms processing and document classification technologies, can help you create the best solutions for your customers.



3. Accuracy



Accuracy is critical for successful document conversion—especially in industries such as legal and healthcare, where organizations must comply with strict governmental regulations. As PDFs and documents are converted, all text and characters must be transferred, all spelling and punctuation must be correct, and all formatting, such as columns, tables and graphics, should be converted.

Having an OCR solution equipped with accurate machine-print OCR, handprint, checkmark and barcode recognition engines will also guarantee proper document conversion. So, when users share, access and edit documents, they're seeing the original—and correct—information.

4. Speed



In the business world, time is money. Whether your application will be used internally or sold to customers, you must guarantee that documents get converted as accurately, and as quickly, as possible. All OCR vendors should offer a free trial process. Have your development team run tests on a few different options to gauge how many documents can be converted per hour and whether human intervention is required during the process.



5. Security



Data security is critical for all businesses today. Whether you provide applications for healthcare, legal or software organizations, you need to convert, deliver and store information securely. When you select an OCR vendor, you're entrusting them with the integrity of your application and the safety of your company's (or client's) proprietary data, so make this a key area of focus.

6. Support



A vendor may provide the best technology, but service and support truly separate the leaders from the laggards. There may be times when your development team needs extra help during the integration process. Or they may find your application needs a very specific feature or capability to take the product to the next level.
